Born in Tulleherin, Bennet's Bridge, Kilkenny. He was the son of Martin Phelan (a Labourer) and Mary Cahill. Previously joined the Civic Guards on 20th March 1922 and reached the rank of Sergeant before he was dismissed on 20th August 1923. Rejoined in 1924 and was dismissed again on 21st January 1926. Leter worked as an employee of the C.I.E. He never married and settled in Gardiner Street in Dublin. He died on 16th May 1965 at St. Mary's Hospital in Dublin. He is buired in St. Mary's Cemetery in Thomastown.
