FURTHER NOTES

Thomas Stephen Fee was the son of Thomas Fee (a farmer) and Margaret McFadden. Married Mary Delia Piggott on 28th November 1929 in Dunmore, Tuam, Co. Galway. He was transferred as a result of his marriage to Multyfarnham, Co. Westmeath in 1929, where he served for the rest of his career, where he settled upon his retirement. Thomas Fee was the driving force behind Multyfarnham willing the Tidy Towns Competition in 1976. He died in 1981 and is buried in Ballyglass Cemetery, Mullingar.
